# Additional Study Support

With year 11 being such a crucial time we are pleased to be able to offer a comprehensive suite of additional support sessions for students. Every week, Monday – Thursday, there will be sessions running after school until 4pm for students to attend.

## Monday

Week A – Languages

Week B - Geography and History

Students will be directed by their subject teachers where they should attend.

## Tuesday - Maths and English

Students will alternate week by week which subject they attending depending on their half of the year group.

## Wednesday - Options subjects.

Students may be directed to a session for their options subjects if staff feel they would benefit from additional support to consolidate or improve their level of attainment. If students are not directed to a session they are free to select which options subject they would like to attend. Some options subjects will run in week A and some in week B.

## Thursday - Science

Students will be informed by the science department which session they should attend. Sessions will run on a rota over three weeks to accommodate the three science subjects.

**It is expected that students will make use of these sessions and routinely attend.**

# Homework and Independent Study

We believe that there is no substitute for hard work when it comes to achieving success. This includes working hard outside of the classroom. Homework at KS4 will be set for all Core and options subjects. This may involve some online work combined with written work, particularly for examination subjects.

As an approximate guide to the quantity of work to be completed;

English, Maths and Science – approximately 60 minutes rising to 90 minutes, as the course progress from year 10 into year 11, per week.

Options subjects – approximately 60 minutes per week.

It is expected that students complete all homework set, to the best of their ability, by the deadline teachers give. Where students fail to submit homework for reasons within their control they will be issued with a homework detention. This detention will be completed for each subject on the night that the additional sessions for that subject are offered. For instance, if a student did not complete their maths homework the detention night for Maths would be a Tuesday which is the day the additional maths sessions run.

There is no reason that students should limit their study outside of the classroom to work which has been set. We would encourage students to be revising from the very start of the course and undertaking additional study or reading to further their knowledge and understanding.
